Welcoming Our New Chief Military & Veterans Service Officer

Army National Guardsman and former Manchester Police Chief Allen Aldenberg recently became Easterseals NH's first-ever Chief Military and Veterans Services Officer.

Allen began his law enforcement career in 1988 with the Goffstown Police Department. He joined the Manchester Police Department in 2003 and assumed the role of Police Chief in 2020 before retiring from the force in 2024 after more than two decades of service.

Allen's military career spans over 30 years, including progressively responsible executive-level experience. He currently serves as Brigade Commander of the 54th Troop Command of the NH Army National Guard.

We are thrilled to have Allen overseeing our Military & Veterans Campus, working closely with our veteran service partners, and supporting the Granite Staters who served our country.

Working Towards Our Vision

Construction is progressing on the Bernadine Herron Center—the building housing our hub of services and retreat center—and the two affordable housing buildings at our Military & Veterans Campus.

Much of the interior work, including sheetrock and electrical installation, is nearing completion on the future hub of services and retreat center, as well as the two apartment buildings. The connector between the apartment buildings—which will

include an elevator to enhance accessibility—is also advancing.

The buildings are expected to be completed by June 2025. Chief Military and Veterans Services Officer Allen Aldenberg aims to begin preparing the campus for use in January 2025. He intends to hire an Assistant Director and a Promotion and Sales Manager in January to assist with campus preparations, coordinate with veterans service organizations, and promote partnership opportunities. Allen also expects to open apartment applications early in early 2025.
